Welcome and Introductions	The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Committee Chair Leanne Guier. Introductions were made.
Review and Approve Agenda	The agenda was approved as written
3. Review and Approve Minutes	The minutes of the January 27, 2017 meeting were approved as written.
4. Legislative Update	Leanne asked Tim Nogler to review the bills of interest. Tim said the list is the same as last week. HB <u>1085</u> , <u>1262</u> and <u>1263</u> have passed out of committee and are now eligible for action on the House floor.
	HB <u>1213</u> , use of greywater, is on the agenda for executive action on February 9.
	There are four bills addressing the state building code council. Both Senate bills had a hearing this last week—SB 5412 and 5500. Leanne provided testimony yesterday on 5500. She clarified that she did not speak on behalf of the Council but rather to her experiences on the council and as a city elected official. She addressed the changes the Council made to their policies and procedures this year based on stakeholder input and also spoke against a 6 year code cycle. Tim noted another issue in the bill is the requirement to pass a bill to adopt code updates and the associated fiscal impact. DES spoke to their concerns regarding the relationship between DES and the Council and where the various responsibilities lay. Senator Angel also asked for budget reports and information on the fund transfer from other agencies. The two House bills, 1436, and 1622 are scheduled for hearings on February 7. Tim also noted there were provisions in both 1436 and 5412 regarding approval of materials and

	products. Testimony at the hearing showed there was some confusion and concern over this issue. Staff has been working with legislative staff to explain how cross laminated timber is dealt with in the building code. Tim also stated there were several bills this session dealing with water rights. They don't directly affect the Council but do modify sections of RCW 19.27.
5. Other Business	None.
6. Adjourn	There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:15 p.m.
