I am writing to support the proposed amendment to the State of Washington International Residential Code in the new section "R602.1.1.1 Used sawn lumber".

I was founder and past-president of the Building Materials Reuse Association; have been Chair of the US Green Building Council LEED Materials and Resources Technical Advisory Group; a member of the American Society of Testing and Materials (ASTM) E-60 Sustainability; and was most recently the Director of the M.S. in Sustainable Design Program in the School of Architecture at The Catholic University of America, Washington, DC. I am also a licensed architect in the State of Florida.

Over approximately 25 years I have conducted extensive research on building deconstruction and the reuse of building materials, including "re-grading" of salvaged lumber. While some potential loss of strength can occur while in-service, much reclaimed lumber is of higher quality than current lumber, and of course older actual dimensional lumber has a larger cross-section than newer nominal lumber providing additional strength or safety factor.

Reclaimed lumber from existing buildings is a very large resource that can provide a readily available stock for renovation and new construction of residential buildings without compromising health, safety and welfare any more than new lumber, when used correctly.
