Hi Richard,

I don't have a problem with the concept of the proposed language but in R602.1.1.1 there should be mention of the need for a grade stamp (i.e. "Used sawn lumber <u>identified with a approved grade mark</u>, in good condition and devoid of areas of decay shall <u>be assumed</u> to meet the requirements of Section 602.1.1 or shall comply with the following:". And then in item #1 of 602.1.1.1 it could say "Dimensional lumber <u>not identified with a approved grade mark</u> that has a nominal thickness of 2-inches....". As written, the language is confusing because R602.1.1.1 bypasses the need for a grade mark making any non-graded lumber to be in compliance with R602.1.1 (not good).

I also would like to go on the record as being opposed to the shaft pressurization code change.

I'll be on the road tomorrow so I won't be able to attend the SBCC meeting but would appreciate it if you could share my thoughts on this code change with the Council.
