Amend section to read as follows:

SECTION 202—DEFINITIONS.

ADULT FAMILY HOME. A dwelling, licensed by ~~Washington~~ the state of Washington department of social and health services, in which person or persons provide personal care, special care, room and board to more than one but not more than six adults who are not related by blood or marriage to the person or persons providing the services. An existing adult family home may provide services to up to eight adults upon approval from the department of social and health services in accordance with RCW 70.128.066.

This code change proposal is in response to ESHB 1023 effective June 11, 2020. The bill mandates the proposed changes to the IBC regarding increasing bed capacity to eight. The changes expand the number of bed allowed if specific criteria is met from six to eight if specific licensing requirements are met.
