Agenda Items	Committee Actions/Discussion
1. Welcome and Introductions	Meeting called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Kjell Anderson, Committee Chair. It was noted there was no quorum so the Committee would take no actions, but would review the documents on the agenda and report to the Council at their meeting on October 9, 2020.
2. Review and Approve Agenda	The <u>agenda</u> was not reviewed due to lack of quorum.
3. Review and Approve Minutes	The minutes of the August 21, 2020 meeting were not reviewed due to lack of quorum.
4. Discuss <u>Final Baseline Study</u> <u>Report</u>	Mark Frankel and David Reddy presented the finalized baseline report. The review focused on the Commercial code since the Residential portion was essentially finalized at the last meeting.
	Mark stated that after review and adjustment of the commercial modeling sensitivity and scheduling, the end results were still essentially the same. However, the review did highlight some of the areas that needed further follow up in regards to both code and reporting improvements.

5. Review <u>Draft 2018 Energy</u> <u>Code Legislative Report</u>	Richard Brown presented an updated draft for the report to the legislature on the 2018 energy code. The group went through the report to review the changes made to date. A few additional changes were made, including referencing a report from the

	Northwest Energy Efficiency Alliance on opportunities for further code changes.
