Agenda Items	TAG Actions
1. Welcome and Introductions	The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. Roll was called, and introductions were made.
2. Review and Approve Agenda	Ted Clifton moved to approve the agenda, Ali Boris seconded, the motion passed.
3. Review and Approve Minutes of May 28 and 31, 2024	Bill Misocky moved to approve the minutes of May 28, Laura Bloyd seconded, the motion passed. Ted Clifton moved to approve the minute of May 31, Sandy (Harpreet Sandhu) seconded, the motion passed.
4. Review Existing Amendments and Significant Changes Documents	Dustin Curb, managing director of the Council, advised the TAG that he is going to propose special meetings for the committees and Council in July to review the reports. He is also going to suggest a 90-day submittal period for proposals, beginning on June 21. <i>IMC Significant Changes</i> <u>Chapter 5</u> The TAG continued review of chapter 5. Sections 506.2, 506.3, 506.5.1, and 506.5.2. Discussion continued on Sections 507 and 507.1. Further discussion was held on Section 507.1.3 as to whether a gas range or cooktop would be considered an atmospheric burner. The TAG voted to recommend retaining the 2021 language and not adopting the 2024 updated language. Section 508.1.1 was discussed and while the TAG

	<p>felt there were still some issues with the language, they voted to recommend acceptance of the new language. The remainder of chapter 5 was reviewed with no apparent issues.</p> <p><u>Chapter 6</u></p> <p>Discussion was held on Section 601.5 with agreement to adopt the changes and form a workgroup to create a code change proposal to address application to HRV/ERV. The remainder of chapter 6 was reviewed for changes.</p> <p><u>Chapter 9</u></p> <p>The TAG reviewed chapter 9, Section 912 and 912.1, 912.2, and 912.3 along with Section 931.1.</p> <p><u>Chapter 10</u></p> <p>Sections 1001.1, 1002.4 and 1006.6 were reviewed by the TAG.</p> <p><u>Chapter 11</u></p> <p>Discussion was held on Sections 1101.1, 1101.1.1, 1101.1.2, Table 1101.2, Sections 1101.6 and 1101.7 and the impacts to the industry imposed under the new refrigeration standards. Section 1102.2.1 and Table 1103.1 were reviewed by the TAG.</p> <p>TAG Chair, Ben Omura noted that one more meeting would be needed to finish up review. It was decided that June 27 or 28 would work best and an email would be sent out for consensus on which day and time worked better for the group.</p>
