The minimum need for additional staffing for larger events for crowd control was determined at the National level by the ICC. Washington State kept the ratio at their original levels, which can expose the State and/or agency overseeing the event to potential legal actions if there is an event that has a lower level of crowd managers than the model code. There is an additional cost for the crowd managers, but only for those between 500-1000.
