Enforceable code language must be used. Amend section to read as follows:

2902.5.1 Drinking fountain number. Occupant loads over 30 shall have one drinking fountain for the first 150 occupants, then one per each additional 500 occupants.

Exceptions:

1. Sporting facilities with concessions serving drinks shall have one drinking fountain for each 1,000 occupants.

2. A drinking fountain need not be provided in a drinking or dining establishment.

The minimum number of drinking fountains shall also comply with Section 1110.7.

This proposal will revise Washington State Amendment Section 2902.5.1 by adding a reference to IBC Section 1110.7. The issue has to do with the way our State Amendments handle drinking fountain requirements in Chapter 29. The base code specifies the required number of drinking fountains in Table 2902.1, and in that table (in the heading) is a reference to IPC Section 410. This section repeats the requirements found in 1110.7 for the number of drinking fountains (2):

410.3.1 Minimum number.

Not fewer than two drinking fountains shall be provided. One drinking fountain shall comply with the requirements for people who use a wheelchair and one drinking fountain shall comply with the requirements for standing *persons*.

Exceptions:

- 1. A single drinking fountain with two separate spouts that complies with the requirements for people who use a wheelchair and standing persons shall be permitted to be substituted for two separate drinking fountains.
- 2. Where drinking fountains are primarily for children's use, the drinking fountains for people using wheelchairs shall be permitted to comply with the children's provisions in ICC A 117.1 and drinking fountains for standing children shall be permitted to provide the spout at 30 inches (762mm) minimum above the floor.

Because the IPC is not adopted by the State of Washington, the amendment does not include a reference to IPC Section 410. As amended, there is no clear connection between the requirements in Chapter 29

and the additional requirements found in Chapter 11 for accessibility. Our proposal adds a pointer to Section 1110.7 (2024 IBC) that will provide clarification and help to eliminate situations we have seen where accessibility requirements are overlooked.
