Add new language in section to read as follows:

711.2.4.7 Energy Storage Systems. Where required by the *International Fire Code*, the *horizontal assembly* separating energy storage systems from the remainder of the building, shall have a minimum 2-hour *fire-resistance* rating.

5. Briefly explain your proposed amendment, including the purpose, benefits and problems addressed. The 2024 International Fire Code (IFC) requires horizontal assemblies provide a 2-hour fire resistance rating when separating areas containing energy storage systems (ESS), from other areas of the building, and has a pointer to Section 711 of the International Building Code (IBC). This proposed additional language to Section 711 of the IBC provides the minimum fire resistance rating required for those horizontal assemblies aligning the IBC with IFC.
