Ricky Campbell second. Motion passed.</p> <p>Hugo Sotelo explained IFC TAG Petition 24-GP1-079: <i>3905.3.1 Extraction Processes Using Flammable or Combustible Liquids or Gasses</i>. TAG members held discussion and provided language modification.</p> <p>Motion: Ricky Campbell moved to recommend Petition 24-GP1-079: <i>3905.3.1 Extraction Processes Using Flammable or Combustible Liquids or Gasses</i> for adoption to the Council. David Mow second. Quyen Thai added friendly amendment for editorial changes. Voice vote was taken, and motion passed.</p>

He noted that Dave Kokot is trying to capture bulk storage of tires and sprinkler requirements and have it retroactive in Chapter 11. TAG Members held discussion on possible editorial issue with model code presented in the petition.</p> <p>Motion: Ken Brouillette moved to refer Petition 24-GP1-039: 1103.5.7 Bulk Storage of Tires back to the proponent for revision. Lance Dahl second. Voice vote was taken, and motion passed.</p>

Ken Brouillette Petition 24-GP1-044: 1107 Lithium-Ion Technology Energy Storage Systems</p>	<p>Ken Brouillette presented Petition 24-GP1-044: <i>1107 Lithium-Ion Technology Energy Storage Systems</i> this is a petition to use a 2027 ICC proposal to renumber items from Chapter 11 to Chapter 12.</p> <p>Motion: Lance Dahl recommend Petition 24-GP1-044: <i>1107 Lithium-Ion Technology Energy Storage Systems</i> for adoption to the Council. Walker Donuji second. Voice vote was taken, and motion passed with one abstention.</p>

Ken Brouillette Petition 24-GP1-045: 1107 Lithium-Ion Technology Energy Storage Systems</p>	<p>Ken Brouillette explained Petition 24-GP1-045: <i>1107 Lithium-Ion Technology Energy Storage Systems</i> which is different from Petition 24-GP1-044. Ken noted that language in current petition exists in the 2024 code. Ken Brouillette noted that if 24-GP1-045 is recommended for adoption, he will withdraw 24-GP1-044.</p> <p>Motion: Ricky Campbell moved to recommend Petition 24-GP1-045: <i>1107 Lithium-Ion Technology Energy Storage Systems</i> for adoption to the Council. Walker Donuji second. Role call was taken, and motion passed with 4 yeas, 1 nay and 1 abstention.</p>
