Welcome and Introductions		Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m. Kjell Anderson welcomed everyone, and roll was called, with TAG members providing a brief introduction.
2. Review and Approve Agenda		The agenda was approved as written.

	The TAG debated the inclusion of an ERI path within the WSEC. The bulk of the discussion centered on what values would be provided for the maximum ERI—the IECC values which some felt would be less stringent than the prescriptive code or wait until the proposal window and bring forward a proposal with values backed by local data and modeling. Motion: Patrick Hanks moved to include the IECC ERI compliance path to the Integrated Draft. Jason Garrood seconded the motion. Patrick then modified his motion to add asterisks to the table values and have a workgroup recommend values to the Committee. The

R406	The TAG began their discussion of WSEC Section R406 and IECC Section R408. They debated the merits, legality and robustness of data for each.
	Motion : Patrick Hanks moved to replace R406 with R408 from the IECC. Larry Andrews seconded the motion.
	Modification to the motion: Kevin moved to include both WSEC R406 and IECC R408 in the Integrated Draft. Larry Andrews seconded the motion. That amendment failed, 2 to 11 with one abstention.
	The vote on the main motion failed, 4 to 9.
R407	Julie Blazek stated that PHIUS+ 2018 is out of date. This will need to be updated via code change proposal.
Chapter 5	In Section R503.1.1.2, Duane Jonlin felt the term "limiting conditions" was too vague and subjective. It was suggested he submit a code change proposal.
	In Section R503.1.1.3, Duane Jonlin felt item 2 "minimizes deviation from Section R402.1." was too wide open and should be considered a reduction in stringency. He moved to delete that portion of the sentence from the Integrated Draft, but the motion died for lack of a second.
	In Section R505.1, Duane Jonlin argued against changing the scope from "full compliance with this code" to "full compliance with this chapter." The change was discussed, and a motion made and then withdrawn; then made again by a second party.
	Motion: Rick Blumenthal moved to retain "code" at the end of the first paragraph of R505.1, Deepa Sivarajan seconded the motion. The motion failed 2 to 6 with six abstentions.
Chapter 6	No TAG significant comments on the referenced standards section.
Appendices	The TAG reviewed the new IECC Appendix RF and compared it to the WSEC Commercial Appendix CA.
	Motion: Duane Jonlin moved to recommend adoption of Appendix RF to be used for the residential provisions in lieu of WSEC Appendix

	CA. Gregory Johnson seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote.
Complete Integrated Draft as Modified	Motion: Duane Jonlin moved to approve the Integrated Draft as modified and move it to the MVPE Committee. Greg Davenport seconded the motion. The motion carried, 12 to 1 with one abstention.
	Anne Anderson asked to be on record as opposing moving the code forward as Section C406 clearly violates the law and this should not be the starting point.
	The TAG discussed the 2024 IECC and the possibility of including it as an option.
	Motion: Greg Johnson moved to also bring forward the 2024 IECC, unamended, as an option for code change proposals. Kevin Duell seconded the motion. The motion carried 8 to 4 with two abstentions.
5. Adjourn	The meeting was adjourned at 12:05 p.m.
