Agenda Items	Committee Actions/Discussion

4. Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Proposal	Todd Beyreuther provided background and pointed out the color-coded updates. He indicated he blended the original document with BIAW's document. Discussion was then held by Committee members and public comments were heard. The "parking spaces" was discussed and it was decided that further discussion and research needed was needed.
