Motion to Approve O.18 (Electrical Readiness) Revisions

- Committee debated whether to require a full dedicated circuit or only breaker space for future heat pump installation.
 Consensus settled on breaker space, sized to anticipated demand; amendments clarified panel/breaker code terminology
- Motion: Motion to accept the proposed modifications regarding electrical panel breaker space and sizing for future heat pump or electrification installations.

- Result: Passed.

Approve O.19 Modification (A/C to Heat Pump)

- Concerns about EPCA compliance and costs for forced upgrades; clarified that either a heat pump or central A/C could be used for replacements, with exceptions for hydronic heat and clarified duct requirements.
- Motion: Motion to incorporate the proposed changes for requiring heat pump replacements as the preferred or mandated solution, including clarifications on system sizing and exceptions.

- Seconded by: Todd Beyreuther.
- Result: Approved.

Approve Johnson Renewable Energy Credit Version

- The Johnson REC version was presented as a refined or alternative approach to quantifying renewable energy credits, likely with specific enhancements or adjustments compared to previous versions, potentially addressing issues such as credit caps, additionality, or project eligibility
- Motion: Approve the Johnson version of the Renewable Energy Credit (REC) standard/proposal.
