Need definitions to determine when each category applies (just duration or also circumstance, official declaration etc)

- Immediate disaster Relief:
  - Temporary rapid placed shelters (Pallet)
    - Governed by LNI
  - Existing Building
    - Minimum standards for egress and fire-life safety
    - Minimum sanitation standards
- Expected Inclement Weather or Near-Term Event (several weeks' notice), temporary use of the space before returning to original occupancy and use:
  - Existing Building
    - Approved by local jurisdiction walkthrough as a currently compliant building for structural.
    - Moderate standards for egress and fire-life safety
    - Moderate standards for sanitation
  - New temporary structure
    - (Would this need to be addressed? Would requirements change?)
- Permanent structure which is designed for or modified to be a temporary emergency shelter use and occupancy
  - Current building code standards? Or some relief to encourage construction, such as energy?

## Other considerations:

Ensure the safety of occupants is improved compared to the alternative circumstance

Needs approval from building official (does this look like a permit submittal? Or an expedited process available?)

Provisions for relief from fire detection provided full-time staff (fire watch provisions)

What is the occupant load factor for this circumstance? Do we need to define one?

Number of washrooms/stalls?

When are bathing facilities required?

What constitutes a "bed" or sleeping area

SDCI standards may be useful as a jumping off point on the various factors that are difficult to determine

How does accessibility factor in? When would it apply?
