Agenda Items	Council Actions/Discussion
1. Welcome and Introductions	The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Council Chair Todd Beyreuther. Roll was taken and a quorum was present. Anyone from the public, who wished to, introduced themselves.
2. Review & Approve Agenda	Motion: Jay Arnold moved to approve the agenda, Ben Omura seconded, the motion passed.
3. Review and Approve Minutes: December 5, 2025	Motion: Jay Arnold moved to approve the minutes, Ben Omura seconded, the motion passed.
4. IBC TAG Membership	Dustin Curb explained the attendance policy and reviewed the attendance log of the IBC TAG. Dustin Curb then went on to say notifications were emailed to each TAG member who was considered out of compliance with the attendance policy. Some clarifying questions were asked and answered. Motion: Jay Arnold moved to designate the 4 positions highlighted on the IBC TAG Log as ex-officio members, Roger Heeringa seconded, the motion passed.
5. Bylaws Update Letter	Dustin Curb provided a recap of the letter submitted by BIAW with recommendations for SBCC bylaw updates after which Patrick Hanks highlighted reasons and areas pertaining to the reason for the letter. Todd Beyreuther noted the intentions of the SBCC were to review the letter and correlate changes with the next code cycle and begin work

	<p>after the 2024 Code adoption. Comments were heard in favor of making some changes and Staff concurred. Discussion was held on the current status of SBCC meeting the OPMA requirements. There was also discussion held on the contents of agendas, and it was noted there could be more detail listed, especially when it pertains to a final vote being expected at a meeting. It was suggested to cancel meetings if there isn't a quorum present and reschedule the meeting. Discussion continued on notifications being sent by GovDelivery and it was said one notification wasn't sent out in the last 2 years. Again, it was stated the intent is to focus on these changes after the 2024 Code Cycle is complete and correlate the changes with the 2027 Code Cycle.</p>
6. Other Business	<p>Todd Beyreuther provided an update on the Legislative Committee meeting request to follow up on budget concerns, which he said was done. Todd Beyreuther then requested discussion on the Single Exit Appendix which led to Legislation's intent, the TAG's recommendation, modifying the base code as opposed to the appendix, and waiting for the 2027 code cycle to make changes. Some clarifying questions were asked and answered, and discussion was held on the process of the CR-102 and public comment.</p>
